Course overview

This course provides the skills and knowledge required to safely prepare for and provide support to clients requiring assistance with medication administration.

The course is relevant to carers and support workers currently working in residential aged care or disability support settings with authority in their state or territory to provide assistance with medication administration.

Participants successfully completing this course will receive a Statement of Attainment for CHCSS00070 Assist Clients with Medication which is a nationally recognised Skill Set.

Candidates seeking enrolment in the Skill Set may apply for a Credit Transfer for any one of the core units. (may reduce course duration)

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Course Pre-Requisites

This course is open to workers who have a minimum Certificate III qualification in an aged care or disability related field or current nursing students. Participants must provide copies of original certificates and transcripts as well as a USI transcript sourced from the USI website to verify current qualifications and determine any credit transfers applicable.

Candidates must be nominated by their employer to enrol in this course. The employer must support provision of an appropriate work placement.

All candidates must complete an online enrolment process to receive all information relevant to enrolling in the course and to determine eligibility.

All candidates must have a valid USI (Unique Student Identifier) Number to receive a Statement of Attainment for this Skill Set.

Unfortunately as we are not a CRICOS Registered provider, we are unable to accept enrolments for this course from international students who are on a Subclass 500 Student Visa.

Strict conditions are attached to the refunding of fees. For further information candidates are encouraged to read the CHCSS00070 Student Handbook provided as part of the Pre-Training Review process.

People with disabilities are encouraged to access training through Government funded programs.

Course Structure and Assessment

HLTHPS006 Assist clients with medication - 1 theory, 1 simulation, 1 workplace sessions

Students attend two (2) classroom sessions plus one (1) day of workplace assessment.

HLTAAP001 Recognise healthy body systems - 2 zoom sessions. 1 theory, 1 roleplay

*students with credit transfer for HLTAAP001 do not need to complete this unit therefore do not need to attend this class

Workplace Assessment - HLTHPS006

Once classroom sessions completed students must attend a one (1) day work placement in their current workplace where they will assist clients with medication administration and undertake practical workplace assessment.

The workplace must have at least 5 clients who take at least 5 types of medications via oral, topical or inhaled routes of administration.

During the work placement, participants are to be fully supervised by a staff member undertaking the medication round and will be supported and assessed by a Registered or Endorsed Enrolled Nurse. EmployEase trainers are available if required at cost.

Workplace assessment must be completed no later than 30 days after attendance at the final classroom session.

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
